At 6:45 p.m., Councilman Brady moved to open the public hearing regarding the application of Providence Canalside Housing Corp. for establishment of Canalside Home Park (on Old Lyons Rd.) Sewer District in the Town of Lyons. Motion seconded by Councilman Paliotti. Vote:

The Hearing would remain open until all comments had been heard. Mr. Ginsberger from Providence gave a presentation about why the sewer district is needed for him to continue moving forward with the project. The plan calls for the installation of about 15 new trailers. Nine current trailers would remain as they are currently owned by individuals living at the site. Several questions were asked by the Town Board. Board members felt there were a number of unanswered questions and questioned why the Town should establish a sewer district prior to a number of items that it felt needed to be done first. Also no signed petition was present for the creation of the district and all property owners in the district were not contacted leading to the belief that the district may not benefit all property owners in the district.

Mr. Jack McCranels Mr. Scott Bailey then addressed the Board regarding the one of the lights being out on the Town Clock atop the Methodist Church. They explained that they had someone look at the issue and the old florescent fixtures are burning out. It was suggested to them that the lights should be replaced with LED's which last much longer and are more energy efficient. Supervisor Emmel assured them the matter will be corrected after the first of the year.
