Councilman Brady indicated he would include Mr. Pincelli in some of the discussions.

Ease of adjustments to Town of Lyons Code if CP outcome suggests need for changes Recommendation that Town of Lyons adopt the proposed new code

Is the Planning Board to have a role in town signage?

LED lighting project: has the Town Board received money back from NYSEG on the converted downtown LED lights, for which it has been paying the metal halite cost and maintenance, although the Town of Lyons has to maintain the lights?

Meanwhile, Supervisor Emmel announced that the LED street light conversion project throughout the former Village has begun and should be completed within a few weeks.

Staffing issues is the latest problem, I been having shortage which is leading into overtime. EMT shortage throughout NYS. I would like to run a solution by the members of the board. For remaining 4 months. I switched to 12 hrs shifts.

Option#l :day shift work 12 hrs night shift 1 medic 12 hrs 6 pm-6 am 1 medic Shrs 6 pm-2am 2am-6am are slowest time for calls.

Option #2 Hire EMS staffing to save on over time.

See Proposal I gave everyone. 3,033.79 is per month. This will also be way to help with state employees allowed for town.

We paid out over \$ 7000.00 in overtime this year not including this payroll. Sometimes overtime can't be avoided due to late calls.

The Town Board decided to allow option 1 for the time being while the Board can further review the option 2 proposal.

Buildings and Grounds Foreman Dale Kenville reported that the department did a number of various project over the last month including picking up garbage in the park as well as adding water to the fountains on a weekly basis. Also, did traffic control for the County while painting lines in Lyons. Also fixed D.I.'s around Town and trimmed bushes at the triangle near the Elementary school and at south canal park (for Dave Burnham.)

Highway Supt. Tim Moore reported that a number of street signs have been ordered for various locations in the former Village, as many have been stolen. They will all be put back up soon. More oil and stoning work needs to be done. The CHIPS paperwork has been turned in for payment reimbursement. Also, culverts are being replaced on Ackerman, Mt. Pleasant, and DeBusse Roads.

Upon the recommendation of Town Zoning Board of Appeals Chairman Jim Wedman, Councilman Brady moved to appoint Ms. Marissa Fisher to the ZBA, replacing Martha Finewood who resigned from the Board earlier this month.

Motion seconded by Councilwoman Greco. Vote:

Councilman Brady then moved to authorize the Town Supervisor to execute the Town Highway contract with Teamsters Local 118. Motion seconded by Councilman Paliotti. Vote:

Meanwhile, Mr. Wedman has requested that the Town's Zoning Board of Appeals have two alternates to sit on the Board. The Town's current law does not allow for any alternates. The Board discussed whether it was in the best interest of the Town to create two alternates to sit on the Board. After a discussion, it was agreed that this action should not be done until the Town formally adopts the recodification of codes from General Code, which is still a while away.

Town Attorney Villani then mentioned to the Board that the clock is ticking regarding the demolition of the Canal Street property. He explained that our current local law on the books talks about putting the property on the tax roll, however, the county now has a history of placing abandoned property on roll section 8, which doesn't allow the county to cover the cost of taxes. Mr. Villani suggested the Town think about assessing the cost of the demolition to the property owner. If that is not possible, he explained that the County Land bank is offering to pay 50 percent of the cost of demolition. More details are forthcoming. Councilman Brady then moved to allow legal counsel to pursue reimbursement of cost of demolition from the property owner of 50 Canal Street when demolition is complete. Motion seconded by Councilwoman Greco. Vote:

Attorney Villani then reported to the Board that the Providence Mobile Home Park (former canalside Park on old Lyons Rd.) will be appearing before the Zoning Board of Appeals on Aug. 31 looking for for approval of a special use permit calling for public sewers to be installed within the park. However, Mr. Villani explained that the ZBA should not consider the request as no sewer district has been created. He has been invited to the ZBA meeting and will alert the ZBA members to that fact.

At 8:40 p.m., Councilman D'Amato moved to go into executive session to discuss a personnel matter. Motion seconded by Councilman Paliotti. Vote:
